Teaching License Registration

As of July 1, 2016, all professionally certified teachers, education leaders and Level III teaching assistants are required to register with The State Education Department in the month of their birth. There is a requirement to register every five years thereafter. There is no fee for the initial five year registration period.

Registration is done through the SED TEACH system.
